


# CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

From 1 fat quarter cut:

- 1 8 ½" (22cm)square.
- 1 2" x 4" rectangle

From a contrasting fat quarter cut:

1 8 ½" (22cm) square.



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## PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

#### Use a 1/4" seam allowance throughout, unless otherwise stated.

Take the small rectangle for the loop and fold in half so the long edges meet, wrong sides together, open and fold either side into centre, fold in half, press and stitch along the long edge.


Take a thermal batting square and lay one fabric square on top right side up. Pin in place.


Place your fabric loop on top with raw edges overlapping the corner of the square slightly.

Take the second square and place on top right side down, pin in place.

Sew around the edge leaving a 2-3" gap for turning.

Snip any excess fabric from the corners





# PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

Turn right side out by pulling the fabrics through the gap. Press and push the corners out.

Topstitch all around the edge and close the gap as you go.

Stitch a cross across your potholder diagonally, start and finish at topstich line with backstitch.

Your pot holder is ready to use!

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
